Abortion Video Energizes Pro-life Students at Liberty University

Even on a Christian campus, being pro-life is not a given. Many students are pro-choice and others are only lukewarm pro-lifers. Here's what two student leaders at Liberty University had to say after I showed them what abortion really is:

"Since I became a Christian 12 years ago, I have just said I was pro-life because that is what Christians are suppose to be. But after I saw your presentation today, being pro-life means a lot more to me than ever before. Seeing all those graphic photos and that video brought me to tears and showed me [abortion] is murder; it is wrong. I want to now fight for their lives—not just tell people I'm pro-life, but actually be pro-life in every way." (Brandon Reid Lewis, Chairman, SGA Christian Service Committee)

"I have always been pro-life because it was the Christian thing to do. Now, after actually seeing [abortion], I am pro-life because abortion is bluntly murder and should be outlawed!! I believe these pictures should be shown to change the minds of people on abortion." (Thomas Ted Turner, Chairman, SGA Spiritual Life Committee)

One of the biggest misconceptions among pro-life Christians is the myth that "pro-life" people don't need to see abortion. "You don't need to come to our church; we're already pro-life!" Or, "Our students don't need to see pictures; they already know we are pro-life." Well, they may know that you are pro-life, but that doesn't mean they are pro-life. And it doesn't keep them from having abortions. One in five women who abort their babies identifies herself as a born-again, evangelical Christian.

If you are not showing pictures to the youth in your church, two things will happen: (1) some of your youth will continue to have abortions, and (2) apathy among Christians will continue to run rampant. **Please contact us if we can help teach the youth in your church to be pro-life, not just say they are pro-life (865-609-9033).**
