## New Volunteers at the University of Tennessee

Last fall, we were back at the University of Tennessee (UT), hosted again by the Pro-Life Collegians (PLC).

*We got 'em trained.* At the places where our donors allow us to go back again and again, it gets easy. Our reputation is so spotless, the university administrators ask only one question, "Is it going to be the same as last time?" If we say "yes," they say, "Here's your parking pass."

*Hope and healing.* If you've been reading my blog ([www.FletcherArmstrongBlog.com](http://www.FletcherArmstrongBlog.com)), you know that we've become real fans of Deeper Still ([www.godeeperstill.org](http://www.godeeperstill.org)), a post-abortion healing ministry that serves clients nationally. We first became aware of their ministry when former client and now team member Debbie Picarello volunteered to help with this GAP. After experiencing the healing that comes from confession and forgiveness, Debbie wanted to take that same healing to others. So she wore a sign on her shirt that said "I've had an abortion; ask me about it!" Her witness helped us reach post-abortive and other students in ways we never could have otherwise. *Hope and healing are an important part of what we are doing at CBR.*

*College students say the darndest things.* Tyler W. commented on the article that appeared in the Tennessee Journalist, the news website of the School of Journalism and Electronic Media at UT. He wrote: "While abortion may be a fairly tasteless act in how it is carried out, that doesn't mean the protests have to be equally tasteless."

I responded, "Tyler, let me get this straight. Killing a baby is 'tasteless,' but showing a photo of a dead baby is equally 'tasteless.' Applying your system of logic, the Holocaust Museum in DC is equally as 'tasteless' as the death camps."
